Equine Pasture and Yard Management

You are invited to an event concerning Equine Pasture and Yard Management.

The event is aimed at all those who keep horses; from those keeping horses at home to the equine livery or riding school business.

Grassland management. Prevention of diffuse water pollution, appropriate stocking density, poaching, in-field compaction, the positioning of gateways and in-field drinkers and feeders.

Manure management – positioning of manure heaps and temporary vs hard bases.

Clean and dirty water separation; stable washings and hay soak water.

Chemical storage.

Regulation - What you do need to know!
