BRC AREA 14 SHOW JUMPING & STYLE JUMPING QUALIFIERS

The Area 14 Outdoor Show Jumping qualifiers were hosted by us at Geldeston on Sunday 30th June.

Things were a little chaotic in the background but this did not stop our teams from continuing the great success they are experiencing this year.

JUNIORS

Helen Regan the Junior Team Manager was off on her holidays for this competition but the other Helen (Sida-Page) stepped forward to deputise and did a marvellous job. Thank you Helen.

Two junior teams were entered in the Novice class, the 'Clarets' and the 'Gold'. Both team had late reserves added.

Flynn's horse 'Knock on the Head' was still recovering from his bout of colic so Connor Sharpe and 'Milly' took their place in the 'Claret' team. He joined Megan Maclean (Magical Mary), Lydia Sida-Page (Harebell), and Emma Taylor (Jeannie Thunderbrook Black Magic)

Rebecca Brooks and Acorn stepped into the 'Gold' team when Shannon Harrisons pony went lame. They joined Laura Leggett (Horse Heaven Rambo), Georgia Wright (Pumpkin

Pie) and Tessa Footitt (Smuggler).

The competition is a two round competition with a jump off if necessary.

For the 'Claret' team Connor and Megan were clear in the first round while Lydia and Emma picked up just 4 faults each. In the second round Megan produced another clear round and this time both Emma and Lydia were clear with Connor picking up just 4 faults. This left the team in a strong position.

The 'Gold' team also did well. Laura, Georgia and Tessa were all clear while Rebecca finished on 8 faults. In the second round Rebecca withdrew meaning all the remaining scores would count. They performed well with Laura producing another faultless round and this time Tessa went clear and Georgia dropped a pole collecting 4 faults.

Both teams made it into the jump off.

Lydia, Megan and Emma went clear for the

The gold team picked up another 4 faults in the jump off when Tessa rolled a pole but both Laura and Georgia produced clear rounds.



This meant Laura, who had not collected any faults throughout the competition, was first individually and will be accompanying the 'Claret' team to the Championships.

There were no teams entered in the Junior Intermediate class but there were eight individuals. We were represented by Georgia Cattermole and 'Tullyreavy Legend'.

The class was won by Isabella Stagg from Finn Valley who finished without incurring any faults over the two rounds. Georgia finished 5th with 16 faults. As there were no club teams entered it is hoped that an Area 14 team can be made up of the first four riders from this competition and that Georgia then qualifies as an individual and will also head to Lincoln for the Championships. Lydia Sida- Page and 'Harebell' competed in the Junior Style Jumping for the club. This competition is a show jumping competition where the way the horse and rider actually jumps is also marked. (A bit like dressage over jumps!) One of the biggest challenges is that the horse must be ridden in a plain snaffle bridle. Lydia did really well finishing in 2nd place.

As with the Junior Intermediate class there were no club teams entered in the Junior Style jumping. The Area steward plans to make an Area 14 Junior team. This means Lydia will represent the Area at the Championship. She will be joined by Daisy Murray (Churchside Garnet) from Haleswoth & District RC, Mary Newlove (Newtimes Hot Gossip) from Suffolk RC and Charlotte Saunderson (Lady Molly Rose Bud) from Carousel RC.

They were fantastic results and we are very proud of all our juniors. Many of them are new to team competitions and have performed really well. As some of our more experienced juniors become eligible for the senior teams next year it is great to see new junior members coming forward.

SENIORS

The Senior teams refuse to be outshone by the juniors. We had one senior team entered in the Novice 80cm, the 'Bees'. These were Lucy Frost (Polly Whispers), June Hall (Merrick Fergus), Davina Cattermole (Hugo Boss) and Megan Duffield (Lancgree Chico).

Halesworth and District RC came second. Another BBRC team off to the Championships! Lucy and 'Polly' are already qualified to go in the dressage so they will be busy.

We were represented in the Senior Intermediate 95 cm class by a team made up of Sam Palmer (Foreigner of the Lowlands), Steve Small (Marcel Midnight Ray), Billie Fobbester (Toby Bouncer) and Emma Julian (Little Irish Magic).

Sam and Steve both scored 4 faults in the first round while Emma picked up 8 faults. In the second round Sam and Steve again added a further 4 faults to their scores but Emma went clear. Billie had a few issues but as 'Toby' is a very novice horse they did well and will benefit from the experience.
