The atmosphere was buzzing, with British Show jumping classes, Pony Club jumping teams and the last leg of the 4* 3 day event taking place at the same time. Although Michelle Hurst's 'Hugo' (ridden by Emma Taylor) is a seasoned professional, the other equine team members, 6 year olds 'Harley' (ridden and owned by Mandie Bradley) and 'Albie' (ridden and owned by Suze Close), had never seen so many other horses, tannoys, spinning tea cups, food stands, alpacas or tents in their lives. Needless to say, they behaved perfectly.

All three combinations took up the opportunity to ride a warm up test; Prelim 14 or Novice 30. In the novice arena, Mandie Bradley and 'Harley' rode a lovely test, finishing 9th with a very respectable 63.46%. Emma Taylor finished 6th with a solid 64.23% – first place was 66.93% so a very closely

contested class!

In the Prelim arena Suze Close and 'Albie' (or Prince Albert, as he prefers to be known) put in an equally solid performance to finish 4th with a score of 66.67%.

The team tests were Prelim 12 judged by Jackie Hagan, and Novice 24 judged by Marcia Fenwick. Again, Mandie and 'Harley' rode a very lovely test scoring 63.27% (nothing but consistent!), putting them within 1% of placing. Poor Emma and 'Hugo'

It is worth mentioning that 'Hugo' and Emma had also taken part in the 90cm Pony Club teams for Waveney Harriers earlier in the day, jumping a fabulous clear round to finish 4th, alongside BBRC member Imogen Sheldrake who jumped clear in the 80cm team to finish 4th as well!

The Prelim 12 arena was very tight – the top 6 places finishing within 2%. Despite the odd buck (just to remind us he is a still a baby) Suze and 'Albie' scored 66.2% finishing in 6th place, missing out on 5th by one collective mark.

With all three scores counting, the team finished 9th overall with a score of 188.7 and went home with a bucket-load of lovely rosettes that feature the silhouette of the beautiful Houghton Hall – our background for the day.

The team competition was won by Cambridge & District RC.

Overall a great day was had by all – it was a great opportunity for the young horses to gain some experience at a bigger event, and for Emma to make her dressage team debut.
